

To coincide with National Aboriginal Day on June 21st ...

“**Doctrine of Discovery; Stolen lands, Strong Hearts**” is a film about a devastating decision, made over 500 years ago, which continues to profoundly impact Indigenous and Settler people worldwide. Pope Alexander VI ruled that the lands being discovered by European explorers at the time was “empty” land and its millions of Indigenous inhabitants were “non-human”.

Canada's Truth and Reconciliation Commission released [94 Calls to Action](#) in 2015, with many of them referring to the Doctrine of Discovery and calling for its repudiation.

This film is one of the responses of the Anglican Church's Primate's Commission on Discovery, Reconciliation and Justice. The purpose of this film is to respond to the calls to action by helping to provide education and insight into the racist foundations of many of our property and other laws still in existence to this day.

Film is 67 minutes followed by discussion.

A Celebration of Wholeness and Healing

Sunday, June 23rd at 10.30a.m.

- We seek God's strength, power and compassion for the healing of our bodies, minds and spirits, to enable us to serve God and one another with all that we are;
- Our new church community in Owen Sound is 2 years old this month ... we celebrate our new beginnings and ask God to help us persevere with our challenges and rejoice in one another;
- There are those among our neighbours and friends whose relationship with God and the Church is broken ... we pray to be instruments for the healing of our common life;
- In the summer solstice, the rhythms of the earth are shown ... we pray for the inspiration of the Spirit to heal our relationship with the earth, so that we may live well here and work to mend what is broken;
- On National Aboriginal Day, we attend to the healing of our relationships with the First Peoples of this land ... we ask God to renew our hearts and minds and to stir in us the desire to learn, both from our past mistakes and from the wisdom of our neighbours;
- We pray for the healing of relationships in our National and worldwide Anglican Church, as we approach the General Synod vote about the Marriage Canon in July;
- May God grant us the wisdom to live well together in community and to rejoice in the rich tapestry of qualities, ideas and gifts here that are part of the diversity of God's Creation.

The service will include times for silence, beautiful music, and a moment when you may come forward to the altar rail to receive the laying on of hands and anointing with prayer for healing.
